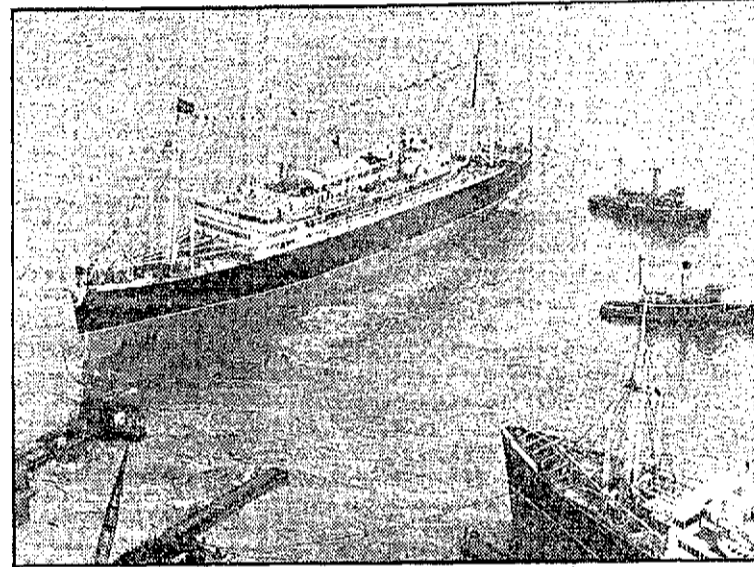
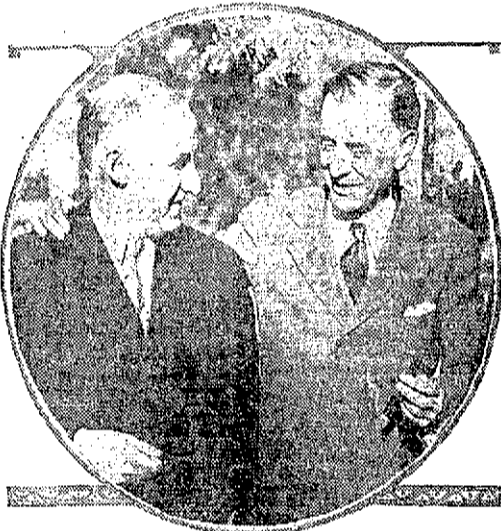
WHEAT KING OF THE WORLD

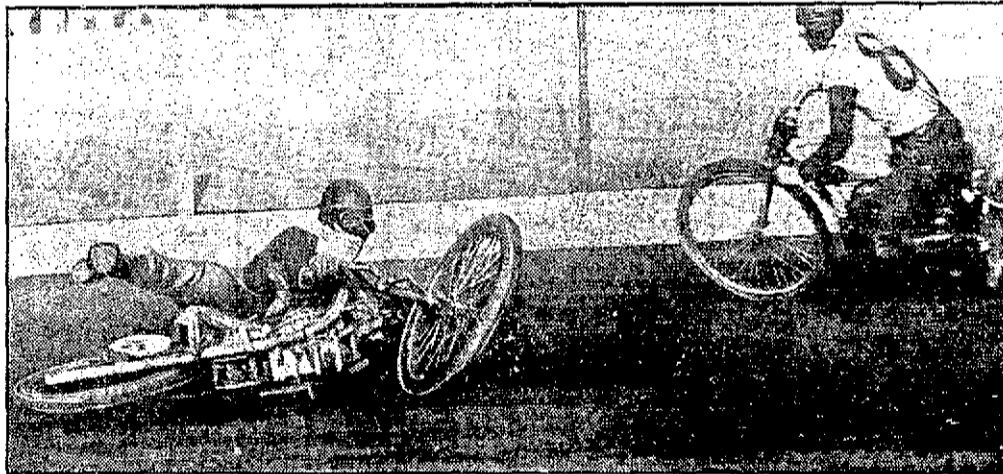


A HUXLEY IN HOLLYWOOD!

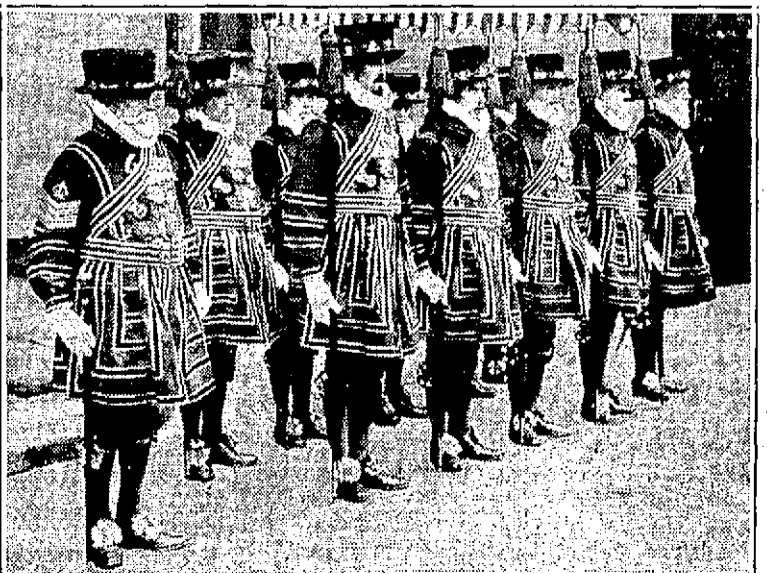


MR. FARLEY INTERRUPTS TO MAKE A LONG STORY SHORT!
