Walcott, Conn, All Met Defeat by Retired Champ

When the definitive biography of Joe Louis finally is written the astute student of the man's boxing life will note that, among other things, he was absolutely murderous toward fancy dans. He started belting them to glory—way back in the days when he was fighting Charley Retzlaff. And in what he says was the last fight of his long and incredible career he nailed one of the fanciest of all—the man named Arnold Cream, who calls himself Jersey Joe Walcott.

He pulverized the clowning Max Baer, the original wayward bus. When Arturo Godoy squatted around the ring like an ape, and rubbed menthol salve into Joe's eyes (the salve was Arturo's idea of a good hair groom) it bewildered Louis. But the next time he fought the Chilean he cooled him in eight when the man tried to ham it up again.

A notable instance was the dispatch with which he dispensed of Lou Nova, who had sold himself on some preposterous guru gibberish which was to make him im-

pervious to pain. Joe knocked him into a flat pin wheel. Just as he blasted fancy dan Conn the second time around.

And Walcott, of course. Walcott was winning I thought... if that's the word. At least he wasn't losing, any more than any man who doesn't get hit ever lost one—no matter what the rule books say about "making the fight."

Walcott stuck and he ran, stuck and ran, stuck and ran, and in those moments of concern and disgust when Louis tried to crowd him and beat him blue and red, he out punched Louis and made the champion cover and grab. Walcott grinned malevolently at the ease with which he could—by feinting a right—make Louis tremulous and wineful and full of self hugs.

The important thing for the biographer to remember is that Louis never—but never—failed to cool out a fancy dan. He always—but always—broke through the tinsel or the charm of the buck-and-wing or the squat or the mood that enabled an opponent to wave to friends in the fourth row, and smashed that man to the ground—and out.

Stars Drop Oaks, 5-3, as Angels Trip Seals Again

HOLLYWOOD, July 14. (NS) Oakland's league leading Oaks were dealt a blow at the hands of the Hollywood Stars here tonight, as Pinky Woods pitched the Twinks to a six hit, 5 to 2, win over the leaders. The loss enabled the leaders to stay ahead of second place San Francisco by two full games, but saw Los Angeles and San Diego again creep up into contending spots.

The Stars went to work on Oakland's ace hurler Will Hafey by getting three runs in the first two innings, adding two more in the eighth to ice the game. The Los Angeles Angels dumped San Francisco for the second night in a row, Don Carlsen scattering four hits to notch a 4 to 3 win.

Portland took a pair from Seattle by scores of 7 to 0 and 7 to 1 as Herm Pilette and Vince Debiassi received credit for the wins. Ranier ace Herman Besse was nailed with the loss in the night-cap.

San Diego's Padres split even with Sacramento in the transplanted Border City series to re-

main in third place. The Sacs won the opener, 3 to 1, but dropped the aftermatch, 3 to 0.
